

## PE and Sports Funding 2015-16 Forest Academy Primary School

The government is providing additional funding of £150 million per annum to improve provision of physical education (PE) and sport in primary schools. This funding has been provided jointly by the Departments for Education, Health and Culture, Media and Sport. This funding is ring-fenced and therefore can only be spent on provision of PE and sport in schools.

## Purpose of funding

Schools must spend the additional funding on improving their provision of PE and sport, but schools have been given the freedom to choose how they do this. A list of possible uses has been suggested.

Forest Academy Primary school has decided to use the money to:

- support and engage all children in physical activities
- pay for professional coaches to teach in partnership with and upskill staff
- pay for professional development opportunities for teachers in PE and sport
- increase pupils' participation in sports and physical activities
- provide places for pupils on after school sports clubs
- improve resources to enable every child to access equipment
- ensure children of all abilities confidently develop their skills through extra support and appropriate equipment
