Science Knowledge organiser – Animals Including Humans (Life Cycles and Basis Survival)





Children will learn:

What do Humans Need to Survive?

There are many things that humans like to have to make their lives more enjoyable or more comfortable. But there are only a few things that we really need.

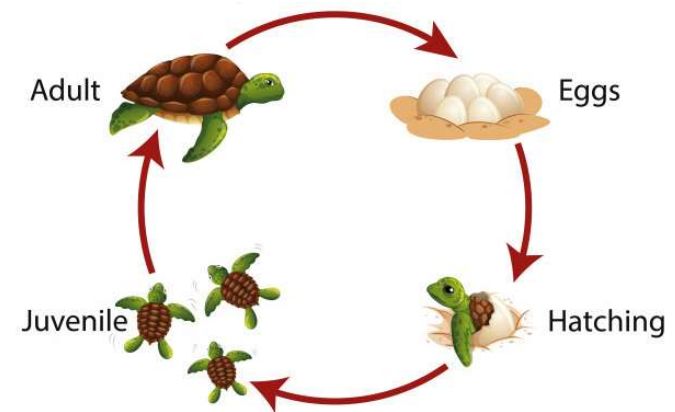
Basis Needs of a Human

Food		Humans need food to give them energy.
Water		Humans get water through drinking and eating.
Air		Humans breathe in air through their nose or mouths and into their lungs.
Shelter		Humans need shelter to provide them with a safe place to rest. It protects us from getting too wet, hot or cold.

adult	A fully grown animal or plant.
baby	A very young child.
growth	To develop and become stronger.
life cycle	The changes living things go through to become an adult.
offspring	The child of an animal.
old	An animal that has lived a long time.
reproduce	When living things make a new living thing of the same kind.
survival	To remain alive.
young	Offspring that has not reached adulthood.

Life Cycle of a Turtle

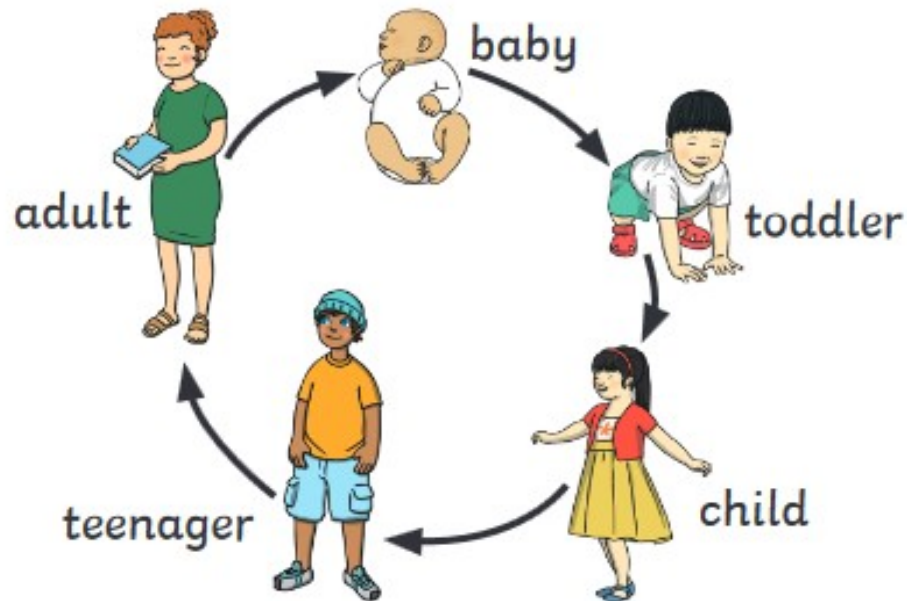


How to Look After a Baby
