

The Five Oceans



Pacific Ocean	The largest ocean and it separates Australia and Asia from North and South America.
Atlantic Ocean	The second largest ocean and it separates North and South America from Africa and Europe.
Indian Ocean	The third largest ocean. It is the warmest ocean.
Southern Ocean	In the most southern part of the world. Surrounds Antarctica.

Key Vocabulary

continent	A large land mass.
earth	The planet on which we live; the world.
globe	A map of the world made into the shape of a ball.
map	Representation of a place.
ocean	A very large body of salt water.
plastic	A type of material.
sea	A body of water between the land and ocean.

Why Does Plastic Damage Our Oceans?

- In recent years people have been worried about the damage plastic pollution is doing to our oceans.
- Sea creatures can get stuck in plastic. Sometimes sea creatures mistake plastic bags for jellyfish and eat them. This can make them sick.
- It is thought that by the year 2050, there will be more plastic than fish in the seas.
- 99% of seabirds have eaten plastic.




Arctic Ocean



Key Facts

North America	The third largest continent. It contains the United States of America, Mexico, Canada and the Caribbean.
South America	The fourth largest continent. It contains Brazil, Chile and Argentina.
Africa	The second largest continent. The Equator runs through it. It contains Egypt, Nigeria and Chad.
Europe	It is the second smallest continent. It contains the UK, France and Spain.
Asia	It is the largest continent. It contains India, China and Russia.
Australia	It is the smallest continent. It contains Australia and New Zealand.
Antarctica	It is the most southern continent in the world. It is where the South Pole is.
